Hello Trask Weekend Campers

We are excited to have your group at camp this weekend. I just wanted to touch bases with you as you are the leader for your group. The following information will ensure your group has a successful camping experience.

- Medical Form: Each person coming to camp will need to have a completed medical form (youth and adults). <u>Please complete Part A and B only</u> (click on link below for current medical form) <u>http://www.scouting.org/jamboree/Home/HealthandSafety/ahmr.aspx</u>
- **Permission Form**: Every child who wants to participate in the activities listed (BB guns, Archery or 22 rifles) need to have permission from a parent/guardian.

Important Information to know and pass on to your group

- Scouting units will be required to turn in an <u>approved</u> Tour Plan for their reservation dates when they arrive at camp.
- List of suggested items to bring to camp on the next page of this program packet
- Campsites are assigned when your group arrives at camp based on the size of your group. <u>We do not take request for</u> <u>campsites.</u>
- Trask has flush toilets and shower facilities at no extra cost.
- Campfire ring will be run by Campmasters; all groups in camp will have a chance to participate. Campfire ring cannot be reserved. <u>There are NO fire rings in camp sites, open fires are not permitted.</u>
- There will be no cooking over the campfire ring; all cooking must be done in your campsite with the use of camp stoves. No open flames are allowed. Propane stoves should be used.
- <u>Charcoal Cooking</u>: You may use the camp bbq's provided you are able to transport out the used charcoal (subject to LA County and USFS Dept.)

BEARS: Camp Trask is located in the foot hills of Monrovia and adjacent to National Forest Land, Bears and other animals can and will visit your camp if you do not take the proper precaution as listed in our camping at Trask policy.

- 1. All food must be stored in sealed containers
- 2. All food need to be stored in vehicles (not in backs of Trucks)
- 3. No food is to be left out in ice chest or stored in or around cooking area or camp sites.
- 4. No food is allowed in tents
- 5. Trash must be taken after each meal to the dumpster located behind the dining hall.






WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP

Directions to Camp Trask

Take the 210 Freeway to the Mountain Avenue off-ramp, in Monrovia. Exit at Mountain, and turn north towards the mountains. Follow Mountain up to Foothill Blvd. Turn left on Foothill and follow it to Canyon Blvd. Turn right on Canyon Blvd. Follow Canyon Blvd. up the hill. After crossing Hillcrest Blvd., which has a stop sign, Canyon will fork. Stay on the right fork. There will be signs indicating Trask Scout Reservation and Monrovia Canyon Park. There is a combination lock at the entrance and a second combination lock at the Bridge. The combinations are changed weekly. Please note the combinations above. They are for the week/weekend that you are attending. One more thing – the road into camp is paved and has some tight turns.
